'Tis the Season!

If you were at the Lighted Christmas Parade last Friday evening you glimpsed our two newest trucks all clean and shiny, ready to go with new plows and salt spreaders. Last snow season the division spent 1,110 man-hours battling the elements, that is 180.25 hours more than the previous season.



When falling snow reaches an amount of 2", or sleet or freezing rain makes travel treacherous,

a snow emergency will be declared. During this time parking on streets that have the snow route designation is prohibited or restricted for snowplowing or clearing until operations are completed.

The Snow Emergency Routes

- Poplar Street
- Lindenthal Avenue
- Washington Street from Lindenthal Avenue to Broadway
- Walnut Street from Broadway to U.S. 40
- Hemlock Street
- Cypress Street from Broadway to 6th Street
- Sycamore Street
- Woodcrest Drive
- 6th Street from Poplar Street to Walnut Street
- Broadway
- Sunflower from Coventry Way to Broadway
- Coventry Way from Sunflower to Iberg Road

These streets are posted with signs indicating the snow emergency route designation.
