

Snow

Despite our current 50° days, when falling snow reaches an amount of 2", or sleet or freezing rain makes travel treacherous, a **snow emergency** will be declared. During this time parking on streets that have the snow route designation is prohibited or restricted for snowplowing or clearing until operations are completed.

The Snow Emergency Routes

- Poplar Street
- Lindenthal Avenue
- Washington Street from Lindenthal Avenue to Broadway
- Walnut Street from Broadway to U.S. 40
- Hemlock Street
- Cypress Street from Broadway to 6th Street
- Sycamore Street
- Woodcrest Drive
- 6th Street from Poplar Street to Walnut Street
- Broadway
- Sunflower from Coventry Way to Broadway
- Coventry Way from Sunflower to Iberg Road

These streets are posted with signs indicating the snow emergency route designation.



Due to the mild weather last winter, in the most current fiscal year which ended April 30, 2012, the Street and Alley Division of the Public Works Department expended only 414.25 man-hours on snow and ice control duties. The previous year it was over 1,300 hours. We took our first delivery of salt in early November and both of our salt storage areas are filled to capacity. Equipment is prepared and we're ready.
