### What is the difference between Sleet and Freezing Rain?

- Both start as snow, but pass through a warmer layer of atmosphere on their way to the ground.
- Sleet passes through a narrower layer, remaining more frozen, becoming pellets that bounce off the surface and can accumulate like snow.
- Freezing rain passes through a larger area of warm air, becomes liquid and then freezes on surfaces colder than 32°.

## Snow Emergency Information

When falling snow reaches an amount of 2", or sleet or freezing rain makes travel treacherous, a snow emergency will be declared.

During this time, parking on streets that have the snow route designation is prohibited or restricted for snowplowing or clearing until operations are completed.
