Upcoming Projects

PW-05-11 SANITARY SEWER CURE-IN-PLACE PIPE

The city is currently seeking bids for the cleaning, televising and lining of existing sanitary sewer mains and the reinstatement of laterals. The project will be in an area from 13th Street to 8th Street and from Chestnut Street to Walnut Street.

The bid opening is scheduled for Tuesday, March 22nd, 10:00am at City Hall. Copies of the bid documents are available in this office, call for more information.

The city received \$100,000 for this project from a Madison County Development Block Grant, the remainder of the project will be funded by the city.

2012 MFT MATERIALS LETTING

At their meeting on Monday, March 5th, the council approved the 2012 MFT Maintenance Materials letting. Pending final approval of the bidding documents by IDOT, a bid date will be set.

NORTHEAST QUADRANT CONSTRUCTION

The construction of the remainder of the northeast section of the peripheral route still has a few hurdles to clear before beginning. The city is currently awaiting approval from the railroad and the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC)

on the bridge design for the project.

Funding sources already in place include \$130,000 from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for the Truck Access Route, \$900,000 from IDOT for the Iberg Road / Route 40 intersection, and \$2 million from Illinois Economic Development because of the new hospital that is being built along the route. At this time the city believes that another \$2.6 million in funding will be forthcoming from the ICC.

If everything continues as planned, construction could begin by late summer. This will be a two year construction project.



LIBRARY LANDSCAPING

Three-Way Creations has been working hard this past week to finish up the landscaping project around the library and new parking lot. Nearly 250 bushes and shrubs, as well as 24 new trees have been planted. New sod has also been placed.
