Code Red Notifications

Highland was lucky to escape the severe weather in the area last weekend. Before the holiday season gets into full swing, take a minute and request that you and your family receive Code Red notifications.

If you have a land line phone with a number that is listed in the phone directory you are already in the CodeRED system. If, however, your family has an unlisted land line number or uses only cellular phones, you need to register your number so that you will receive the emergency notifications.

As important as the severe weather notifications are, the Public Works Department uses the CodeRed notification system to help keep residents informed of other things that may be going on in their neighborhood. Probably the most important use by this division is for Boil Order notification. When a boil order is issued a call goes out to the residents in the affected area. If you have opted out of the general notification calls, moved since you first registered your number, have a new phone number, or have not signed up to receive any of the emergency notifications you could be missed when notifications are made.
