Code of Conduct

The Highland Parks & Recreation Department does not allow anyone to:

- Endanger the safety of others
- Use verbal or gestures of profanity

- Misuse or abuse the equipment or facility
- Verbally or physically abuse staff

**Staff may require violators to leave and/or suspend or revoke any memberships for any length of time without refunds.*

Accident Policy

The department does not provide insurance for injuries suffered while participating in programs or using facilities. Therefore, we urge everyone to contact your insurance carrier in the event of an accident.

Refunds, Credits and Prorated Classes

No refunds are offered on memberships other than those moving to a location 15 or more miles further away from Highland from the current address and providing the required documentation for verification. Refunds for one-day activities must be requested prior to their start. Refunds for all other activities, excluding athletic leagues, must be requested prior to the start of the second class. After the second class, refunds are only offered on a prorated basis when medical documentation of inability to participate is provided. Refunds for athletic leagues must be requested prior to the teams being picked. Membership expirations may be extended for days missed when medical documentation is provided. In all cases, the department prefers to offer credit for future purchases.

Forms Of Payment

In addition to cash and checks, all major credit cards are accepted and debit cards are honored. Monthly auto debit from a checking or savings account is also available for annual memberships. However, some of our programs are supported through organizations and cannot accept credit cards.

Financial Assistance

Because some residents of the Highland area may be unable to participate in programs or services due to economic hardship, the Highland Area Community Foundation has funds available. The resources are available for 20-visit value cards and water safety courses. For more information, call 651-1386 and ask for Nancy or Laura.




Chance Cards



Membership Processing

•No refunds are offered on memberships other than those moving to a location 15 or more miles further away from Highland from the current address and providing the required documentation for verification.

•An auto debit membership may be cancelled after completing one continuous year by completing the cancellation form. Both heads of the household must sign the cancellation form for family memberships. In order to stop the payment for that month, the paperwork must be completed by the first of the month. A \$20 penalty applies for insufficient funds.

•Photo identification is required by anyone 16 years of age or older. A parent or guardian may vouch for children's identification if they are under 16.

•Family rates include all people at the residence. Proper verification of their address, such as official mail, is required.

•Grandparents who provide legal documentation of permanent custody of a grandchild living at their residence may place their grandchild on their family pass.

•An ID will be issued and is required for entry into the facility. Replacement cards are available for \$5.

Membership Information

•Each additional family member is \$30 annually or \$10 for 3-month passes.
