REPORTS:

- 1) Historic Properties Reports
 - Latzer Homestead
 - The homestead took some hail damage from a storm near the end of March. Insurance will cover structural damage.
 - Application for the National registry is about to be submitted or reviewed this May.
 - Kaeser Park
 - o Roof damage from the hail storm in May is being evaluated.
 - City Hall Belfrey (previously referred to as the bell tower)
 - o Can Highland Machine help with preparation of a finial?
 - We may have a person available to prep the trim piece on the belfry.
 - Fred Groves has the pole for the top of the belfry. May go ahead and get it installed when possible.
 - o The sign is completed and installed.
 - o The address of the belfry is the 1200 block of Broadway.

4) Historic Building Inventory

 Looking to install some sort of information at the kiosk located at the new parking lot in the 700 block of Main Street, the former location of several historic buildings. Jacob Rose and intern Spencer near completion. Need to send to the City for approval.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Highland Historical Society fundraiser possibility: Historical Tour of Century Properties. Interpretive signage possible through Everlasting Etch or others. Might be able to get a grant for signs through the Highland Area Community Foundation. Signs could be blue to match the new City signs. Karen Barker is interested in helping with this.
- Demolition of the old Primary school building at 1810 Lindenthal resumes on April 28th. It was believed the Highland Masonic Lodge had removed portions of the gym floor for sale as a fundraiser but this was found to be incorrect.
- The photo survey of the old primary school building led to the discussion of photo-documenting other locally historic structures in town including the Chapel at the city cemetery, The Latzer Library, the Belfry, and several others. Tentative schedule:

Lustron House (Karen Mason's granddaughter's house on Lemon Street), Joe and Jacob, May (?) 2025,

Cemetery Chapel – Sara and Jacob, June 2025,

Latzer Library – Jacob and Jeff, date to be determined.
